

How to access information

Administrative access policy

We have an [administrative access policy](#) which aims to make it easier, faster and cheaper for complainants to access certain documents. Complainants may apply for administrative access to:

- all the documents they have given to the Office
- all the documents the Office has given to them
- documents which are publicly available.

There is no fee for administrative access.

If you would like to apply for administrative access to documents, please provide us with the following information in writing.

- which documents you want
- whether you would like the documents to be given to you in hardcopy
- how you would like the documents delivered (by email, to a street or postal address or left for collection at our reception desk)
- a certified copy of one of your identity documents (the [administrative access policy](#) has more information about this.)
